Last Week

Most of us never give a thought to how lucky we are to have consistent and reliable access to clean drinking water. Walter Hughes, our presenter last week certainly gives thought to the value of clean drinking water, and he has



made it his life's work to help isolated and impoverished communities in Ghana and South Sudan gain access to this fundamental necessity of life.

Hughes says that in addition to being passionate about giving people access to clean water, he is passionate about ending neglected tropical diseases that are associated with the consumption of contaminated water. His work to drill wells in needy communities has been one of the most significant contributions noted in the fight to end Dracunculiasis, a disease that is commonly known as guinea worm disease. The disease is contracted when someone drinks water that is contaminated by "water fleas." Approximately a year later, the resulting parasitic worm will emerge from the skin, creating an excruciating painful blister that feels like a hot poker rising from under the skin. In 2011, efforts to increase access to clean water paid off, and the disease was completely eradicated in Ghana. Significant progress towards ending Buruli Ulcers has occurred in tandem with these efforts.

South Sudan is the next immediate target for Hughes. Together with hundreds of trained volunteers, he has drilled wells and educated health workers to recognize symptoms of these diseases earlier. His work has earned him White House recognition as a Champion of Change.
