Club member Robbie Barch was our speaker. Robbie is a representative of Northwest Mutual Insurance. He presented some unbiased information on long term care insurance. Long term care insurance is designed to provide finances to fund an individual's care, whether at home, in a nursing or assisted care facility, hospital, adult day care center or hospice. He



presented research from the U. S. Dept. of Health that indicated 70% of people turning 65 will need some type of long term care insurance.

After reviewing the ever increasing daily cost of senior care, Robbie noted when purchasing any type of long term policy it is vital to check the rating for the company you select. Premium prices can vary greatly, but starting a policy at the age of 50 or so is a great way to minimize the long term premium cost. He recommended members consider using "The Shoppers Guide to Long-Term Insurance" from the National Association of Insurance Commissioners as the best source of information.
