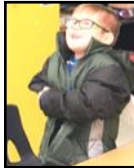

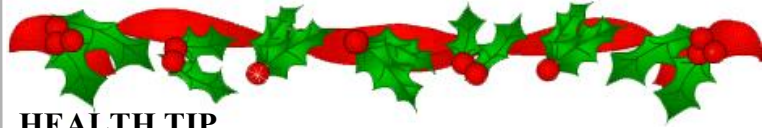

Dick Wiltshire is in the hospital being treated for atrial fibrillation. Please keep all in your thoughts and prayers.

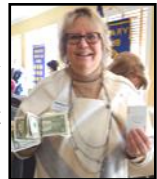


HEALTH TIP
