OUR PROGRAM LAST WEEK

Our speaker was Rosemary Green of the HJH (Hester J. Hodgdon) Libraries for All Foundation. Rosemary grew up in Blacksburg and now lives in Kernstown. She was a librarian for 38

years and and now serves as the secretary of the Executive Board of the HJHLAF. The non-profit supports a small public library and schools in rural Nicaragua, the second-poorest country in Latin America.



Jane Mirandette, a Paul Harris fellow, founded the HJHLA Foundation in 2003 and founded the San Juan del Sur Library in 2001, the first lending library in Nicaragua. Very few people in the country have access to books, which are very expensive. There was originally a fear that "a book loaned was a book lost," but that has not turned out to be the case as book borrowers (even children) are diligent about returning them.

The HJHLA is in the process of renovating a new building to move the library. The Rotary Club of San Juan del Sur was founded in 2013 and does community and education projects, including public sanitation, school restoration and supplies, community wells, and medical equipment/supplies such as wheelchairs and mosquito netting. Rotary grants have helped fund many of the projects and have led to new computers for the library and other worthwhile projects. The library also has a meeting room that is used for health education and community meetings. The library even has a 3D printer – the first in Nicaragua! It has been used to replace hard to find parts and has also been used for vocational training.

The RACHEL project provides mobile internet access to remote areas of Nicaragua. Apps such as Zoom and WhatsApp are very handy in connecting Rotarians to their US counterparts.

Rosemary is returning to Nicaragua in August and would welcome any of our club members who would like to join her!
